Office in Hierarchy

Lord Gautama became Lord of the World on January 1, 1956 when Sanat Kumara vacated that Office to return to Venus. That office was confirmed in Wesak 2010 when Sanat Kumara accepted the office of Bridge to Solar Christ Consciousness.

Lord Gautama is the first from the humanity of Earth to hold the Office of Buddha. The previous ones came from other planets to serve on behalf of the developing humanity of Earth, while the other Buddhas retreated into the Veil, he stepped forward to assist the advancement of human consciousness. Lord Gautama attained the Enlightenment of the Buddha twenty-five centuries ago. He attained his enlightenment during the night of the Full Moon day of the month of May, about the year 528 B.C. His being was transformed and he became the Buddha, and for a total of 49 days, he was deep in rapture, after which he again turned his attention to the world, where he taught the Dharma for 80 years. The key discovery of his quest was the Great Teaching of The Four Noble Truths, the Eightfold Path and the Middle Way. Today, Lord Buddha holds the office of Lord of the World. At inner levels, he sustains the threefold flame of life, the divine spark, for all children of God on earth; he sustains that threefold flame in every heart by a filigree light extending from his heart. He maintains that contact until the individual soul can rise from the seat-of-the-soul chakra into the secret chamber of the heart and the divine spark by her own attainment, wedded to her Holy Christ Self. Buddha's Enlightenment and Ascension is celebrated on the day of the first full Moon of May each year known as the Wesak Full Moon Ritual.
